August 15, 2003 - 20 years ago

A tremendously horrible day and a wonderfully glorious day. It depends upon your perspective! It certainly was a day that changed our lives! I remember sitting on the floor, outside the ER at U of M hospital, in the dark. There were no lights because of the blackout, praying and begging God that Todd would be okay. I was surprisingly calm and felt the presence of the Holy Spirit. It was the day that the tree fell on Todd and pinched off his left arm. An ER nurse gave me his wedding ring shortly after they allowed me in the emergency room and I remember saying, "Honey, if you didn't want to go to Tanzania, you could have just said so!" And I believe he did smile.I was both so very grateful that Todd was alive and so very devastated when the surgeon clearly said they could not reattach his arm and that there was a huge risk of infection.

Somewhere in the piles of containers and boxes in my dad's basement there are several newspaper articles, pictures, cards of sympathy, notes of encouragement, as well as journals documenting my thoughts of that time of our lives. As I write this, I wish I had access to them so I could better remember! I do remember the tremendous outpouring of love from so many of our firends and even at times people didn't know at all! I know that many of you also have many memories of those months. Please feel free to share them with us or others.

Now, I don't think of that day very often. However, the 20th anniversary of that day is certainly time to remember. It still was both a tremendously horrible day and a wonderfully glorious day. God has used us, Todd especially, in so many wonderful ways both in Tanzania and in the U.S. God has provided for us, taught us, used us for his purposes, strengthened and loved us in so many wonderful ways. The Serving Our Neighbor Ministry and Team have become something we could not even imagine on that day in 2003. It is overwhelming and so humbling to realize what God has done.

When I asked Todd how he feels today....his response was"I still miss my arm! And I miss giving big bear hugs."




HAPPY BIRTHDAY DENNIS!
